 - a. Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied from *His* journey, sat thus by the well. It was about the sixth hour.

- 4. Not a question, but... It may be helpful to get some background of the relationship between Samaritans and Jews.
 - a. John 4:9 Then the woman of Samaria said to Him, "How is it that You, being a Jew, ask a drink from me, a Samaritan woman?" For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.

	What is the source?
5.	What is the purpose of the fountain of water in us in verse 14?

a. but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life."

9. What is the meaning of the word "implored" in verse 47?
